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








Road fatalities in the EU and current target

















Road safety policy framework 2021-2030

- **Starting point:** Policy Orientations 2011-2020 and Declaration of Valletta (March 2017)
- Principles:
 - "Safe System" approach
 - Confirmation of "Vision Zero" (2050)
 - New interim **targets** (50% reduction in fatalities and serious injuries)
 - Monitoring based on key performance indicators
 - Reinforced coordination between levels and sectors
 - Funding support
 - Global dimension









Strategic Action Plan on road safety

- Actions as part of the third Mobility Package:
 - Proposed revision of Infrastructure Safety Management Directive
 - Proposed revision of General Safety Regulation for vehicles (GROW)
 - Communication "On the road to automated mobility: An EU strategy for mobility of the future" (GROW)
- Concrete actions with timeline for current Commission mandate, indications post-2019
- Addressing all "Safe System" areas (governance, enabling and funding, roads, vehicles, road use, emergency response) as well as emerging challenges and EU's global role
- Call for voluntary commitments





Objectives of the revision of the RISM Directive

- Reduce the number of fatalities and serious injuries on EU road networks through improved safety management of road infrastructure
- Foster knowledge sharing and harmonisation between Member States on RISM procedures and requirements
- Improve follow-up of findings of RISM procedures
- Protect vulnerable road users
- Improve deployment of new technologies



Key proposed measures

- **Extend the scope** to cover motorways and primary roads outside the TEN-T network as well as all roads outside urban areas that are built using EU funds in whole or in part
- Introduce network-wide road assessments, a systematic and proactive risk mapping procedure to assess the "in-built", or inherent, safety of roads across the EU
- Mandate transparency and follow-up of infrastructure safety management procedures
- Make it mandatory to take vulnerable road users systematically into account in all road safety management procedures
- Set general requirements for road markings and road signs in order to facilitate the roll-out of cooperative, connected and automated mobility systems
